### **4. Fund independent truth.**

As long as food and drug companies fund research, dominate conferences, and influence media, truth will remain a hostage.

We need citizen-funded, open-source, conflict-free science.

### **5. Build parallel systems.**

Who needs prestigious journals when we have platforms like YouTube

and Substack? Who needs ghostwritten reviews when we can share our science directly?

We need new journals. New conferences. New communities.

Free of financial capture. Rooted in open inquiry.

Built by those who still believe medicine is a moral act.
